# 2011 Hawk Ridge Highlights

#### Celebrated 40th season of fall raptor banding and the fall raptor count at Hawk Ridge!

Raptor Banding: Three banding stations were run this fall under the new cluded 1,454 owls (2nd highest total at Hawk Ridge) and new season record of four Bald Eagles!

Raptor Count: 70,757 raptors of 18 species were counted in close to 943 hours of observation this fall. This includes a new season record of 5,688 for Bald Eagles! High numbers of Sharp-shinned Hawks. Northern Harriers, Rough-legged Hawks, and Redtailed Hawks were also recorded.

season of this fall count. Over 320,000 birds (non-raptors) of 142 species were counted in 2011. This includes new state high counts for Rusty Blackbirds, Common Redpolls, and Northern Shrikes. Funding to analyze and report the amazing North Shore Migration phenomenon was received from the Duluth Superior Area Community Foundation Biodiversity Fund.

Environmental Education Naturalists were on-site daily at Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve delivering public interpretation about the migration, bird banding demonstrations, and bird adoptions throughout September & October. We thedral Grove Committee of The Naoffered over 40 free weekend education programs (raptor id, owl evenings, songbird strolls, etc.) for the public. We also taught formal programs to over 40 private groups. A grand total of approximately 18,000 visit Hawk Ridge each fall!
