



RAPTOR COUNT - 43RD YEAR

The Raptor Count was conducted from August 15 to November 30 at the Main Overlook. **59,809** raptors were counted. The count was above average for the last 10 years, but 23% below average since full-time coverage began in 1991. It was the second-best season on record for **Turkey Vultures, Bald Eagles, and Rough-legged Hawks**. Of concern were below average counts for Ospreys and American Kestrels. The mystery of poor Broad-wing and Red-tail flights continues to puzzle us. Nevertheless, the peak of **1,205 Red-tailed Hawks** on October 25 was one of the highest day counts in the last 10 years. A highlight of the season was seeing **2 Snowy Owls** (1 of which was banded).

NON-RAPTOR COUNT - 8TH YEAR

In the words of Count Director Karl Bardon, "...a truly incredible season that was full of surprise and set all kinds of record." A total of **358,815 migrant non-raptors was a new record season total**. For example, impressive counts included 1,089 kinglets, 76 Brown Creepers, 856 thrushes (Swainson's Gray-cheeked, Hermit, and Veery), 2,337 Common Ravens, 46,215 warblers of 26 species, 9,564 White-throated Sparrows, 2,939 Dark-eyed Juncos, and 111,372 finches.

RAPTOR BANDING

HRBO banding teams at 3 stations logged a total of **241 banding days**. 3,888 raptors (16 hawk species and 9 owl species) were captured and banded, including 53 foreign recoveries, 12 returns, and 1,015 owls. A **Prairie Falcon and Snowy Owl** were banded for the first time at Hawk Ridge. An impressive **9 Bald Eagles** were banded (5 adults, 3 hatch-year, 1 third-year).

PASSERINE BANDING

Passerine Banding was conducted from August 7 to October 20. A total of **2,005** birds comprising **61 species** were banded. Most common species banded were American Redstart and Nashville Warbler. Highlights included an Eastern Bluebird, 3 Pileated Woodpeckers, and the odd bird of the year, a **Sora**.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

Our naturalists were on Hawk Ridge daily during September and October providing pointers on identification of raptors and non-raptors, facts about migration, bird-banding demonstrations, and kids' activities. We offered 26 public programs for approximately 320 people. These programs included Eyes on the Skies/Beginning Hawk Watching, songbird banding programs, Hawk Ridge Primers, and Experience Hawk Ridge. Our staff and 2014 trainee conducted 79 private programs reaching 1,690 students and adults (pre-K through college, Scouts, adult tour groups, etc.). During the year, we continued our monthly bird-related outdoor program with students at St. Michael's Lakeside School. Raptors in the Classroom, a partnership with Lake Superior Zoo, provided 15 school visits for 4th and 5th graders. Approximately 18,000 visitors of all ages and from around the world come to Hawk Ridge each fall to experience migration!

EXPERIENCE HAWK RIDGE - 9TH YEAR

In 2014, we divided this program into two versions. The original version continued to cover basics of migration, banding and counting, and how to use binoculars, with information geared for the age of the audience. The new version was developed specifically for Duluth Public Schools 5th-graders. The content of the program was designed to complement specific 5th-grade Minnesota State Standards.

SPRING RAPTOR COUNT (WEST SKYLINE HAWK COUNT) - 17[™] YEAR

The Spring Count was conducted on 12 days (total of 62.5 hours) over a period from March 13 to May 1. Observers counted **6,445 raptors of 14 species**. The spring highlight was **2,939** raptors counted on April 20. On April 25, Frank Nicoletti & Dave Carman counted 252 raptors as part of the annual Hawk Migration Association of North America (HMANA) Raptorthon to raise \$1,085 shared between HMANA and HRBO.

43 YEARS AND STILL COUNTING: 2014 HAWK RIDGE HIGHLIGHTS

WESTERN GREAT LAKES OWL MONITORING - 10TH YEAR

This is a joint effort in Minnesota and Wisconsin to monitor population trends for the region's owl species. Partners include Natural Resources Research Institute, MN DNR, WI DNR, HRBO, and many citizen science volunteers. A total of **313 owls** comprising 8 species were recorded on 105 routes (no owls were recorded on 45 routes). The top 3 species counted were **Barred Owl, Great Horned Owl, and Saw-whet Owl**. Detections of Eastern Screech Owls were low; Long-eared Owls rebounded from 2013 numbers; there was a significant spike in numbers of Saw-whet Owls in Minnesota.

PEREGRINE WATCH - 9TH YEAR

Peregrine Watch was staffed 5 days a week by 2 HRBO naturalists and one intern from May 28 to July 20. We added Wednesday and Saturday evening hours for visitors – **3,098 people visited**Peregrine Watch. The peregrine adults started with 4 eggs of which **1 egg hatched**. This nestling – a male – was banded with color band black/red E/85 and fledged successfully.

HAWK RIDGE NATURE RESERVE STEWARDSHIP

We conducted the **3rd breeding bird survey**. Counters have identified a cumulative list of **40 species** as potentially nesting within the 365-acre reserve. Hundreds of people – fat-tire bikers, joggers, hikers, dog walkers, sledders – visit the reserve throughout the year. Improvements were made to the Banding Research Station. Culverts were installed in areas damaged by the 2012 flood. Hawk Ridge hired ecologist Barb Delaney to complete a vegetation survey of the reserve and to make recommendations for dealing with invasive species. Duluth Legacy Endowment Fund (Duluth Superior Area Community Foundation & City of Duluth) and MN Lake Superior Coastal Program (MN DNR & NOAA) provided funding for the survey.

HAWK RIDGE SUMMER SOCIAL EVENT - 4TH YEAR

Board member **Bob Owens and wife, Mary Ellen**, generously opened their home for a summer social attended by approximately 60 people. The event raised **\$2,200** for Hawk Ridge programs.

"TOMMY" THE TURKEY VULTURE

Research Biologist, David Barber, from Hawk Mountain Sanctuary and Hawk Ridge Banding Director, Frank Nicoletti, captured an adult Turkey Vulture in early August in West Duluth and placed a wing tag and satellite transmitter on it. This is the first Turkey Vulture in the Midwest to be fitted with a tag or transmitter as part of the **Turkey Vulture Migration Project**. Data collected has provided information on roost locations, hourly and daily movement. Turkey Vulture "Tommy" began its migration on October 4, 2014, and reached its wintering ground on October 27. Tommy made local movements in southern Mexico near the Guatemala border during the winter.

SNORE OUTDOORS FUNDRAISER

As a fundraiser for HRBO and Habitat for Humanity, intrepid Rudy Hummel slept outside for 365 nights in tents, snow caves, and hotel parking lots during one of the coldest, snowiest winters on record. Rudy raised more than \$3,000 for HRBO, which was used to help fund a new traineeship program.

43 YEARS AND STILL COUNTING: 2014 HAWK RIDGE HIGHLIGHTS

HAWK RIDGE BIRDATHON - 28TH YEAR

The Hawk Ridge Birdathon is a **fun and friendly competition** among birders to raise funds for HRBO. On May 17, eight teams across St. Louis County tallied a grand total of **172 species** while sitting, hiking, or driving. Eagle Optics and Lake Superior Garden Center donated prizes for the event. Teams raised more than **\$2,400** by soliciting pledges from friends and HRBO supporters.

HAWK WEEKEND FESTIVAL

By all measures, Hawk Weekend Festival on September 19-21 was one to remember, with more than **100 people registered** for field trips, workshops, dinners, and speakers! **Jan Green** received HRBO's inaugural **Hawk Ridge Legacy Award** for her decades of service to Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve and HRBO. On Saturday, visitors witnessed a spectacular day on Hawk Ridge, with more than 4,000 raptors of 14 species (including several low kettles of Broad-winged Hawks and two uncommon species for Hawk Ridge —2 **Swainson's Hawks** and a sub-adult Golden Eagle) and more than 5,000 non-raptors. 65 generous organizations, businesses, and individuals donated items and services for our silent auction and raffle.
