

2016 ANNUAL REPORT

Every bird flying over Hawk Ridge inspires us to keep focused on our mission. to protect birds of prey and other migratory birds in the Western Lake Superior Region through research, education, and stewardship.

If you consider the first organized hawk watch, which took place in 1951, to be the birth of the idea that has grown into Hawk Ridge Bird Observatory, then we are celebrating our 65th birthday! Other important milestones include:

- 1972: The first systematic raptor count began; the banding research station opened; and Duluth Audubon Society, with a loan from the Minnesota Chapter of the Nature Conservancy, gave the City of Duluth the funds to purchase land on the highest summit of the Ridge.
- 1973: The City of Duluth purchased an additional 250 acres that now forms the 365-acre Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve.
- 1979: Friends of Hawk Ridge was established to support educational and research endeavors.
- 2003: Hawk Ridge Bird Observatory was organized as a non-profit to manage the nature reserve and raise awareness and funds for expanding educational and research programs.

<u>Hawk Ridge is a valuable research enterprise</u>. The data our counters and banders have been gathering since 1972 are helping scientists better understand avian migration. This information is also providing conservationists with the tools to track vulnerable populations of raptors and songbirds, especially in the era of global climate change we now live in.

<u>Hawk Ridge is an incomparable outdoor classroom</u>. It's one thing to read a book about migration; it's quite another experience to witness the phenomenon of migration as it unfolds along the North Shore of Lake Superior. Every autumn, school children, college students, and visitors can see the facts of migration come alive in the skies above. Our educators, naturalists, and volunteers strive to share the details of migration and raptor and songbird identification with thousands of visitors. Our hope is every visitor will take away a fact or memory of migration that will increase awareness of protecting raptors and songbirds and the corridors they need to survive.

<u>Hawk Ridge is a priceless asset for Duluth and Minnesota</u>. Every fall, visitors from around the world come to Hawk Ridge. Our guest register has entries from thousands of visitors from all 50 states and more than 40 foreign countries. This pilgrimage to Hawk Ridge demonstrates the potency of ecotourism for the economy of Duluth and it shows a global audience the value Minnesotans place on sharing and protecting our natural assets.

Our Mission in Action: 2016 by the Numbers

The 2016 fall migration was another record-breaking, thought-provoking season at Hawk Ridge. A total of **415,604 migrants** were counted, slightly below last year's half-a-million, but included record-breaking numbers for Sharp-shinned Hawk, Merlin, Peregrine Falcon, and Bald Eagle! The numbers below demonstrate how we are putting our mission into action. Thank you for your support in making this possible!

Raptor Count Highlights

66,369 raptors counted, slightly below the long-term average.

Totals for Sharp-shinned Hawk, Bald Eagle, Merlin, and Peregrine Falcon were greater than any other season since counting began in 1972.

Bald Eagles and Peregrine Falcons continue to rebound from historic lows, demonstrating the effectiveness of targeted conservation efforts.

Merlins are increasing as they adapt to nesting in more urban areas.

The Sharp-shinned Hawk count is especially good news, since this species has been in long-term decline. Typically Hawk Ridge has only one day each season with over 1,000 Sharpies. This fall there were six such days with a **peak of 1,454 Sharp-shinned Hawks on September 20**.

Finally a respectable Red-tail total! The **season total of 8,867 Red-tailed Hawks** is the best season since 2006. Is the long period of low Red-tail numbers over?

Of continued concern, counts of Northern Goshawk, Broad-winged Hawk, Rough-legged Hawk, and American Kestrel were all below average.

Non-raptor Count Highlights

349,235 non-raptors counted

132 Greater White-fronted Geese, an unprecedented number.

Flocks of American White Pelicans impressively large this fall with a season total of 699.

This year's big surprise—the amazing number of *Empidonax* flycatchers! The season total of 394 empids is more than all previous seasons combined.

Crazy numbers again this season for Ruby-crowned and Golden-crowned Kinglets (more than 3,600) and Brown Creeper (173).

Although the number of migrating thrushes heard at night always dwarfs the number actually counted during the day, a record number of more than 1,200 thrushes in the genus *Catharus* were seen in morning flight this fall season.

And the **prize goes to the warblers—with a total of 78,297 counted**, another season record! October 6 was the **peak day for warblers**, **when 19,465 were counted**. A season total of 27,688 Yellow-rumped Warblers compares to the previous average of only about 3,500!

Bird Banding Highlights

- **1,806** number of **owls** banded (1,732 Northern Saw-whet Owls, 66 Long-eared Owls, 7 Barred Owls, 1 Great Horned Owl)
- 92 number of Northern Saw-whet Owls recoveries (70 foreign & 22 returns)
- **1,178** total number of **passerines** banded of nearly 60 species (including warbler highlights of Northern Parula, Bay-breasted, Connecticut, and Black-throated Green; most common species were Black-capped Chickadees, Dark-eyed Juncos, Brown Creepers, Ruby-crowned Kinglets, and Nashville Warblers)

Other educational program and event highlights!

- **2,302** kids and adults who attended one of our 132 fall programs
- **3,902** number of people we connected with at outreach events, new field trip and workshop offerings, and evening speaker series.
- **18,000** approximate number of visitors who came to observe the **fall bird migration at Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve** and learn from our education staff and volunteers
- **885** people who visited **Peregrine Watch** in downtown Duluth at Lake Place Park
- **3,000** combined **hours** provided by our loyal team of **more than 70 volunteers**

199 – total number of species seen by 11 teams across St. Louis County on the 30th Hawk Ridge Birdathon! Over \$3,000 was raised for Hawk Ridge education & research!

365 – number of acres at Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve that Hawk Ridge Bird Observatory helps steward through volunteer trail maintenance, litter clean up, invasive species treatment, and education.

75 – new species added to the Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve species list (including 26 new species of lichens and plants, and 17 insects!)

10 – years of serving on the Hawk Ridge Board of Directors as Board Chair and Education Committee Chair – Tim Bates, who was honored as the Hawk Ridge Lifetime Achievement Award recipient at the Hawk Weekend Festival.

JOHN RICHARDSON, Count Interpreter Grew up birding in East Yorkshire, England. Married a Minnesotan and came over 18 years ago to work on her family's dairy farm. Now he and his wife live in Duluth with their three boys, who are frequent visitors to Hawk Ridge with dad.

"At Hawk Ridge, a mass migration of birds goes on right over our heads every fall. It's incredible—yet many people don't even know it's going on. You hear about the migration of huge herds of wildebeests in the Serengeti or caribou in the Arctic. Well, we have our own mass migration right here in Duluth. What makes Hawk Ridge even more special is that it brings together a diversity of birds and people. I get to meet and talk with folks from all over the world, with beginning bird watchers, experts, and people who just wandered up to the Ridge to see what's going on. Then there's the sheer joy of

watching the kids who come with their parents or school groups. It's therapeutic in a way—all of us in this beautiful location sharing an amazing natural spectacle. It feels like family."

ANNA KENNEDY, 2016 Banding Trainee
From Half Moon Bay, CA. With a conservation biology
degree from UC-Davis, she's done bird surveys and
banding in tidal marshes and montane meadows. Now
she's added Hawk Ridge and raptor banding to her
résumé and her love of nature.

"Watching the fall migration at Hawk Ridge has been an incredible experience. It's exciting to stand alongside people visiting Hawk Ridge for the first time as they experience it. It's been inspiring to watch the dedicated staff and volunteers sharing their knowledge about species identification and migration patterns. I spent most of my time at the Raptor



Banding Station, where I was continuously awed getting to see birds up close while collecting valuable data that can contribute to conservation and help answer future questions in our everchanging world."



MARGIE MENZIES, Public Program Director Grew up in Pennsylvania, New York, and Kansas. Spent her childhood exploring the great outdoors. Now she devotes her adulthood to sharing her vast knowledge of the natural world with Hawk Ridge visitors, young and old.

"Every bird that flies over Hawk Ridge has a story to tell. Our banders and counters are gathering thousands of details to piece together these stories. Things like how long they live, how far do they go, how long does it take them to get from point A to point B. There are all kinds of things we are working to figure out and share with migration biologists and bird lovers of all sizes. I love telling these stories to people who visit Hawk Ridge. Take the Blackpoll Warbler. These tiny birds, some starting as far north as

Alaska, leave their breeding grounds and fly southeast until they hit the Atlantic Ocean. By this time they've doubled their body weight—adding about 10 to 11 grams of fat. They have put the fuel in the tank because *now* they're going to fly nonstop across the Atlantic to northern South America, an over-water journey that makes Blackpoll Warblers one of the most extreme long-distance migrants on Earth! On the wing for at least 72 hours, all on the energy found in about half a Snicker's bar."
