

<u>Hawk Ridge Bird Observatory Apprentice Program</u> Fall Bird Banding Apprenticeship - Seasonal Announcement

Hawk Ridge Nature Reserve is one of the premier fall bird migration sites in North America. Raptor migration research and education have been conducted at the site for over 50 years! It's the western-most count on the Great Lakes with an advantageous location on a rocky ridge overlooking the western tip of Lake Superior. Annual fall averages include 63,000 raptors and 200,000+ passerines/other birds counted and approximately 3,000 raptors banded. Fall migration highlights include an amazing diversity of 15-20 different raptor species! The Hawk Ridge Bird Observatory (HRBO) in Duluth, MN is the non-profit organization that manages and provides bird research and education at the nature reserve. The fall research and education staff of HRBO are key representatives in HRBO's mission of promoting conservation of raptors and other birds in the Western Lake Superior Region through research, education, and stewardship.

HRBO is offering two Bird Banding Apprenticeships for those seeking to train and gain further skills pertaining to bird banding research. Training will primarily focus on raptor banding (hawks and owls), but also have opportunities for passerine banding (songbirds). The goal of the apprenticeship program is to provide an opportunity to gain hands-on field training experience to help assist with future research projects, as part of their career or higher-level education. Apprentices will train with key staff with extensive knowledge and expertise in the field.

The Bird Banding Apprenticeships run for 9 weeks from August 30th to October 31_{st}, 2024 (with potential extension of 1 week before/after). A stipend of \$300 per week and lodging is provided. In order to apply, apprentices must have at least 1 prior position/training/seasonal field experience with bird banding and an intent to continue to pursue a career or higher-level education related to ornithology. Apprentices must have an undergraduate degree and a valid driver's license with a personal vehicle for transportation. Note: The Hawk Migration Association of North America Conference will be held in Duluth, MN November 7-10. This is an optional learning opportunity that apprentices may choose to attend.

You will attach your cover letter and resume through that link. Applications will be accepted until filled (note: early applications are encouraged and preferred by Friday, May 3, 2024).

Please include in your cover letter and/or resume:

- 1. A description of the skills you hope to obtain through the banding apprenticeship program
- 2. A description of your educational and/or career goals upon completion of your apprenticeship
- 3. A description of courses/training and/or work experiences relevant to bird banding
